Attendance vs Representation (The Empty Seat Story)

- Attendance patterns
- MPs who rarely speak during plenary
- Committee participation records
- Sitting time versus constituency engagement claims

The Legislative Graveyard

- Which bills from previous sessions remain pending?
- How long do laws take from tabling to adoption?
- Are adopted laws being implemented by stakeholders?

Gender and Generational Lens

- Speaking time by gender
- Youth representation versus youth policy rhetoric
- Committee leadership by age group and gender
- Substantive vs ceremonial roles for women MPs

Unusual Story Angles Cont'd

Language Dynamics in Parliament

- Use of English vs French in debates
- Translation delays or complaints
- Procedural language disputes
- Regional sensitivities in legislative discussions

Cost of Parliament

- Annual parliamentary budget
- Allowances and benefits structure
- Cost per sitting day
- Spending versus legislative output

Digital Transparency Scorecard

- Are plenary sessions streamed?
- Are committee reports publicly available?
- How accessible is parliament and MPs to the digitalisation drive?

Common Reporting Pitfalls

Avoid:

- ✗ Event-only coverage (“Parliament opens...” and stops there)
- ✗ Copy-paste of official speeches
- ✗ Treating speculation as fact
- ✗ Ignoring committee work
- ✗ Over-reliance on political party talking points
- ✗ Missing citizen impact angle

Quick Checklist

Before publishing, confirm:

- ✓ Bill name and number verified
- ✓ Quotes properly attributed
- ✓ Speculation clearly labelled
- ✓ Citizen impact included
- ✓ Opposition and ruling party voices balanced
- ✓ Data cross-checked
- ✓ Minority or marginalised groups covered
